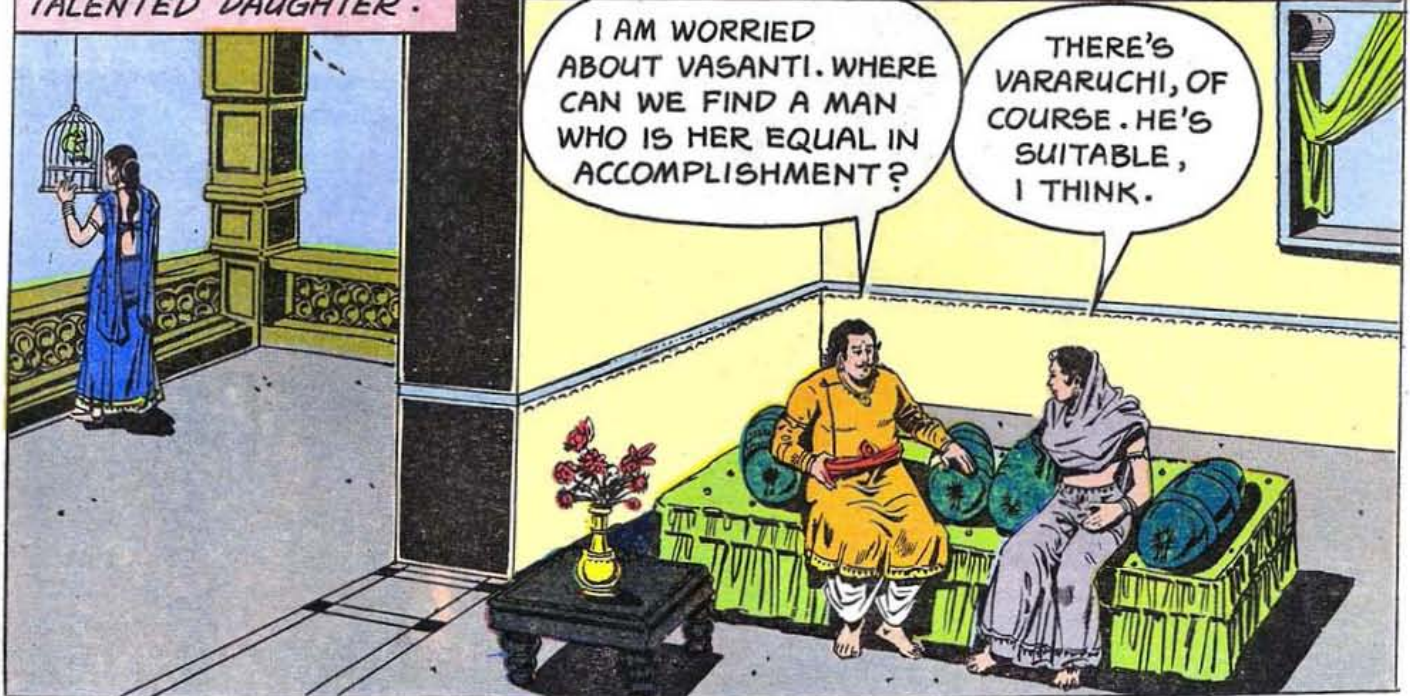
KALIDASA, ONE OF THE GREATEST POETS THE WORLD HAS EVER KNOWN, WAS DENIED THE CLASSICAL SANSKRIT EDUCATION USUALLY GIVEN TO BRAHMAN BOYS. VASANTI WAS VERY PROUD OF HER KNOWLEDGE.

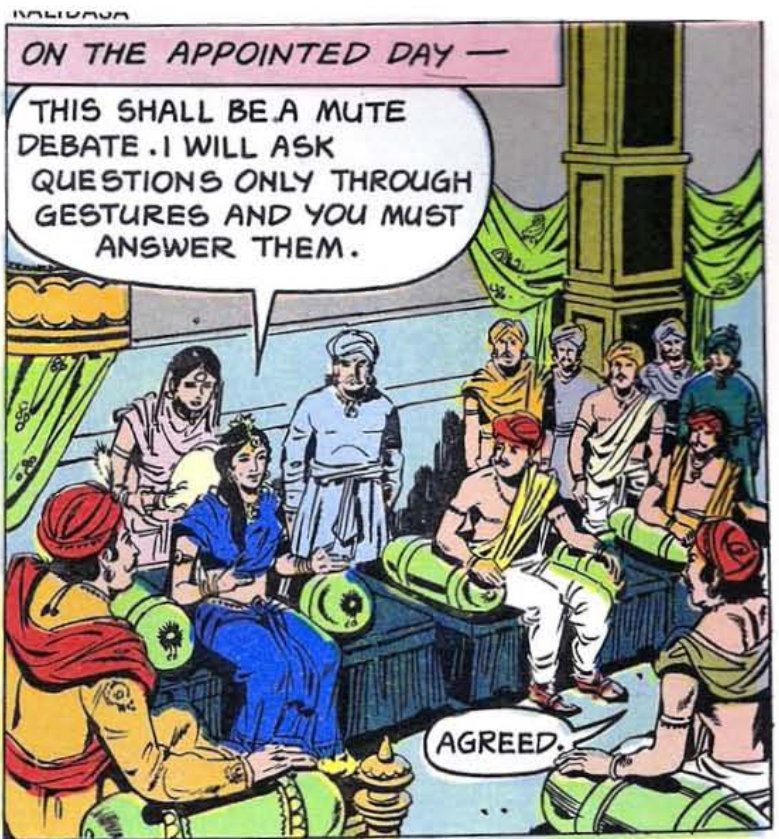

THEN VASANTI RAISED ONE OF HER FINGERS.



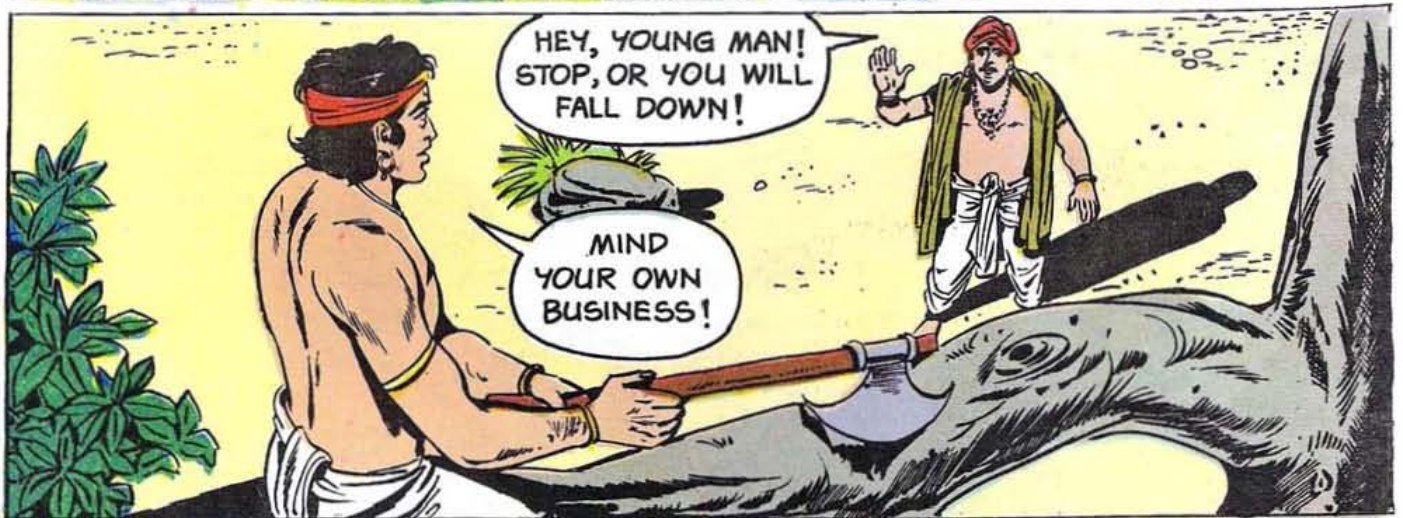
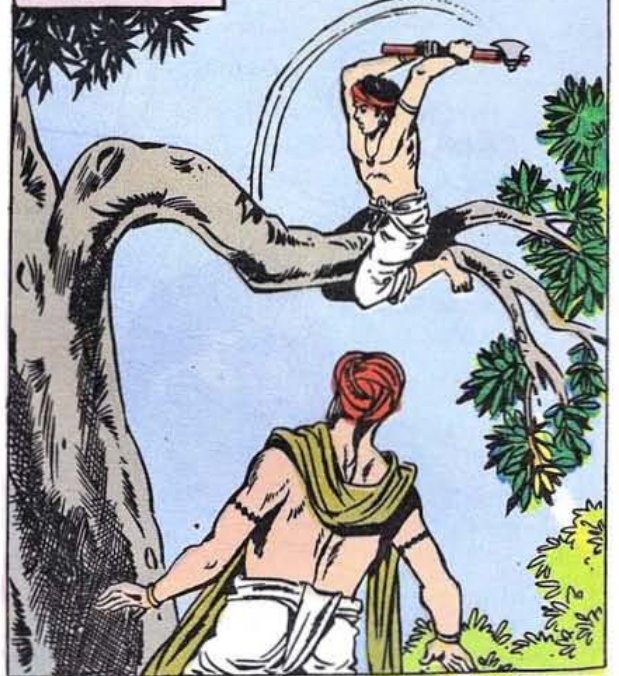

A HUSBAND HAS POWER FOR GOOD OR ILL OVER A WOMAN'S LIFE.

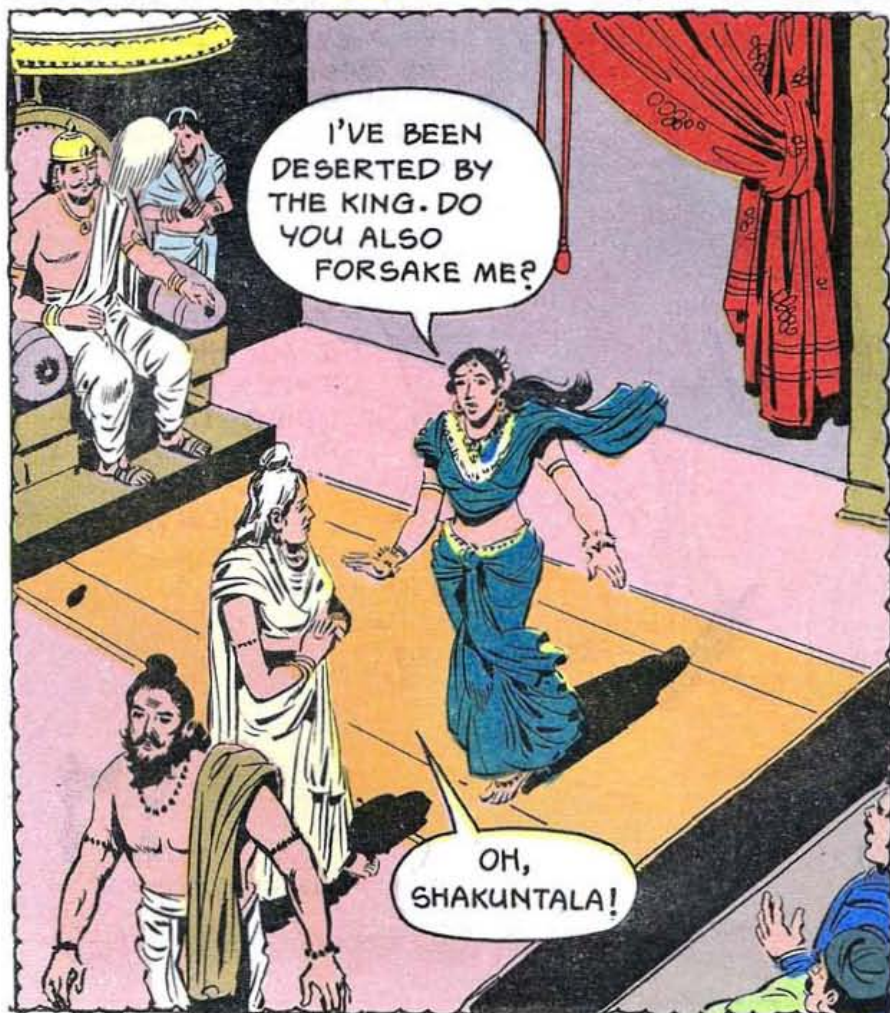

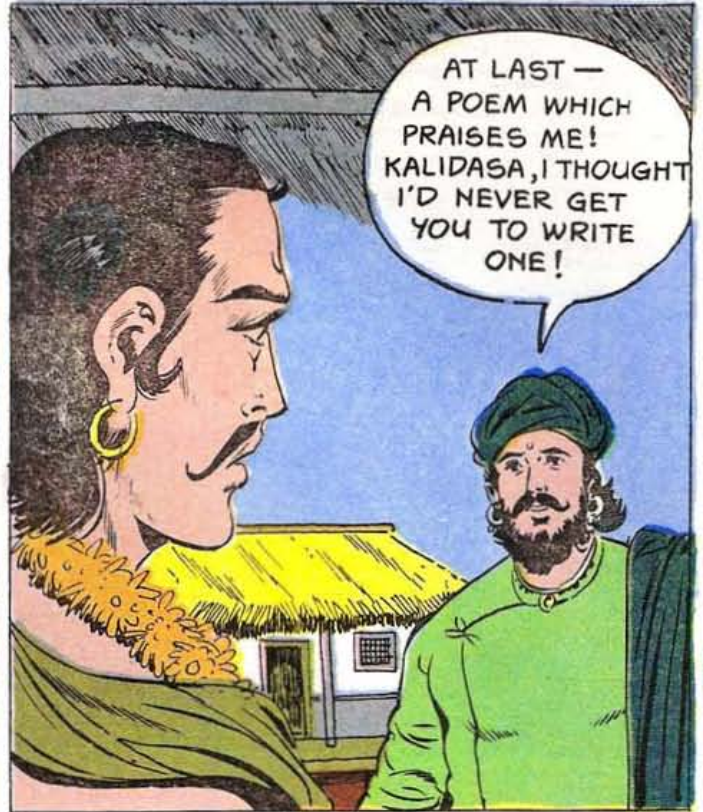


KALIDASA WAS SO OVERWHELMED, HIS GRIEF TOOK THE FORM OF VERSE.

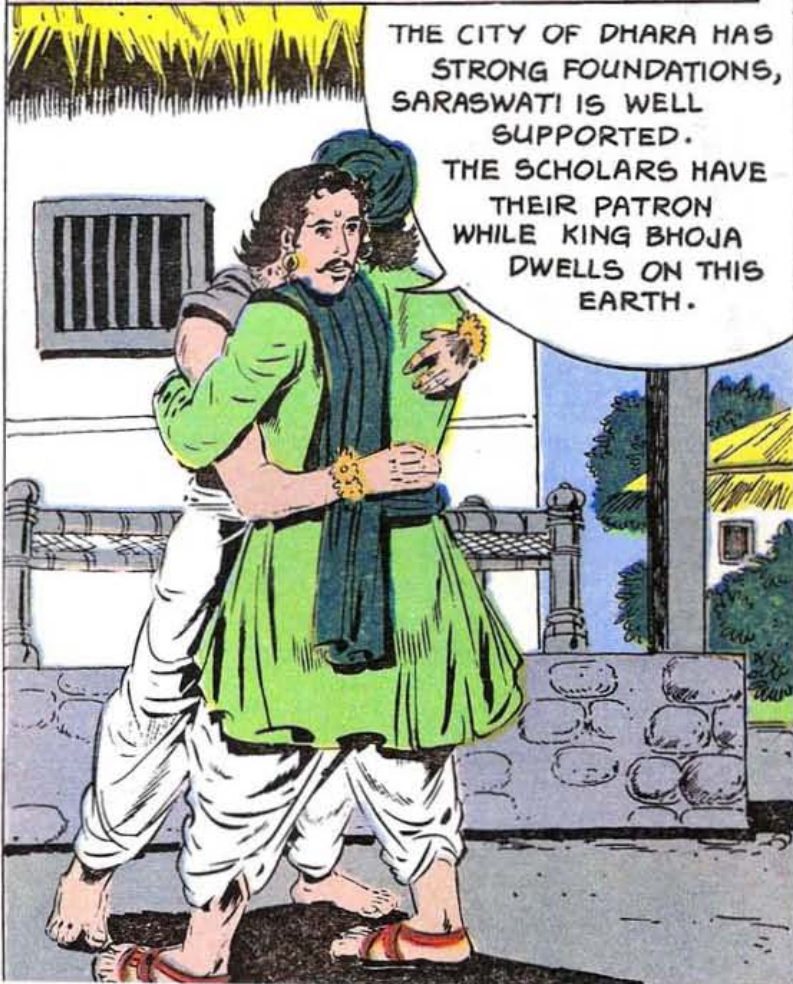

KALIDASA NOW RECOGNISED THE KING. SO HE MADE MINOR CHANGES IN HIS VERSE —

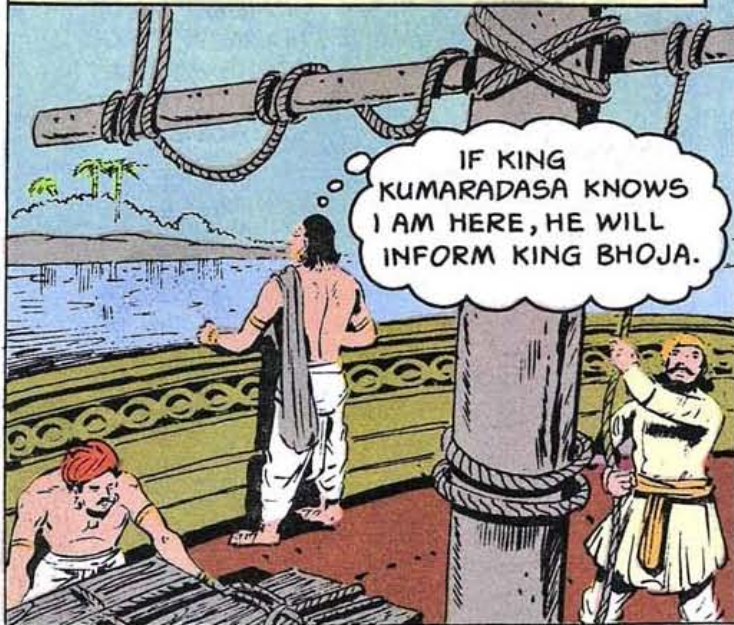

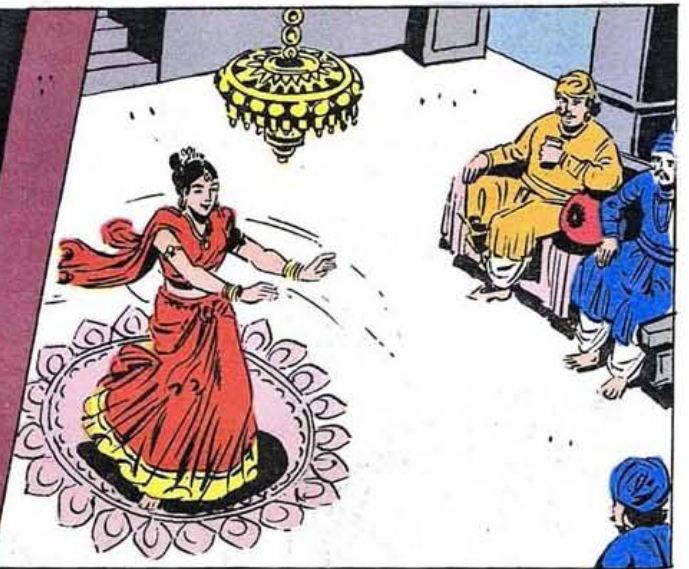


IF KING KUMARADASA KNOWS I AM HERE, HE WILL INFORM KING BHOJA.

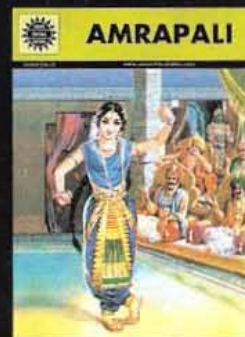
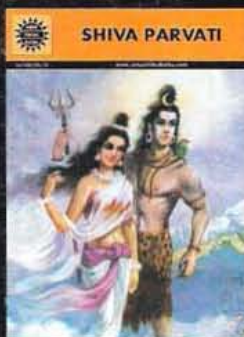
Kalidasa owes his fame to his Sanskrit play *Abhijnana-Shakuntala* (*Shakuntala Recognised by the Token Ring*), the long epic poem *Kumara-Sambhava* (*Birth of Kumara*) and the lyric poem *Meghaduta* (*Cloud Messenger*).

Kalidasa, who lived some time in the middle of the 4th and early 5th centuries A.D., has left no account of his life. According to popular legends, he owed his ingenuity as much to Goddess Kali's blessings as to his own talents.

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
